(even better)



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
Hi, I'm Hindy and I'm so proud to be a student at Cheder Chabad of Monsey. I especially appreciate being in a frum school because I wasn't able to attend a yiddisher school until I entered Grade 5. Until then, I went to different goyishe schools to help me in my disability. I needed to go to special schools because I am blind. B"H this is my only disability and I am able to function just like anyone else with the skills I learned at New York Institute for special education in the Bronx. I can read braille and walk independently using my white cane in a place that I am familiar and if not, I use a human guide. appreciate all the help and encouragement I get from my classmates and from the staff. I take notes using my braille sense which is a very cool computer that I can read braille and write on it. I can also download many books on the braille sense which is great because I love to read. It is very important for people to know that when they speak to men they need to first introduce themselves otherwise I don't know who is speaking to me and it's kind of embarrassing to guess who it is. It is just like when you are having a conversation with someone and you forgot their name and it's kind of embarrassing to ask them what their name is.

On Monday, Cheder Chabad prepared a very interesting presentation about Hindy Markowitz. We learned how it feels to be blind. We would like to tell you some facts about Hindy. She was born premature. She had 3 surgeries on her eyes. Her family put together a slideshow from when she was born until her אם משל and she sang a song while the slideshow was playing. Everyone was very inspired by Hindy's story! When she was born, the Doctors said she would not make it. She stayed in the hospital for 6 months. She got a lot of visitors. When she grew up, she went to Camp Simcha. She started going to Cheder Chabad when she entered 5th grade. Now she reads more than 5 books a week in braille. She writes in braille too. One of the stories she wrote in braille was passed around and we were able to feel the raised dots.

RABBI WIEDER—PHYSICS CLASS

The 6th grade physics lab class has been learning about the different types of energy and where it all comes from. 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
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
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ראש חודש מרחשון Assembly
