A PEEK AT OUR WEEK

Welcome back! We were happy to be able to greet our students back in school this week. The sounds of learning filled the halls as we appreciated getting back to our old routine.

In Mrs. Mandel's first grade class, meticulous attention is given to the instruction of suffixes and red words. The class is focused on building their sight word recognition through various methods. The boys worked on sentence building by using their creativity and knowledge in order to transform phrases into oral sentences. They enjoyed reading a poem about squirrels and cutting it out and decorating it. The classroom is a ton of fun to watch as the boys are engrossed in decorating each day's letter sound with yarn and sticks. In math, the boys learned how to solve horizontal subtraction sentences using pictures to subtract, This was followed by a thorough math review and test on subtraction concepts using operations and algebraic thinking. The boys were confident and fluent in the material.

Even with all of the changes, Mrs. Nadav's class has been making beautiful progress in many areas. The 2nd grade boys really understand the concepts of place value and had fun using base ten manipulatives to show how numbers can be regrouped in different ways. The first graders raced through the chapter on subtraction and know how to write equations two different ways. The boys have all been working on their writing skills. They are very carefully forming their letters, taking the time to properly place them on the correct lines. Each day the class discusses a Word of the Day for vocabulary. The boys first attempt to explain the meaning of the word and then each boy creatively thinks of a sentence which uses that word. Some sample words were: fascinating, investigate, frustrated, gigantic and huge (Which one of those would you think is bigger? Is that size only relative to something else?) The boys' favorite time of the day is our read aloud. We have just finished our first chapter book, which had a very surprising twist at the end, and we have begun a new one.

What a week Miss Klatzko's second graders had! They were so excited to be back in school after an extended time away. In math, they learned how to add and subtract tens and hundreds mentally, advancing to recognizing number patterns and creating their own as well. The class began to explore comparing 3 digit numbers in various ways. With the election excitement, there was plenty to discuss during News on the Run. The boys added insightful comments and relevant information as they learned more about the president and the government. Everyone did a beautiful job on their election day posters, working together as a team to create a masterpiece. The class is learning about the five senses in science. With I Spy, blindfolding, and guessing the sound, it was so much fun to learn about touch, sight, and sound through interactive activities. We can't wait to see what is in store for the remaining senses. The boys are constantly building their reading skills and practicing their handwriting. "Homonym" was the word of the week and the boys enjoyed coming up with their own, learning how to spell and use each word.

Mrs. Eckstein did mini-'projects' with the third graders this week. On Tuesday, the claas magically turned into 18 year olds (Harei Ani Kven 18 Shanah...), as the class discussed a bit about the election. Each boy received an "I voted" sticker that Mrs. Eckstein got for everyone when she voted. Gavi was 'mechazek' us by reminding us that it is all in the hands of H-shem, and we just need to do our hishtadlus. On Wednesday, the class made 'foldables' to reinforce what they learned about carnivores, herbivores, and omnivores. On Thursday, the class reviewed News on the Run to keep 'current' about other things going on in the world. They also learned how to write a "lab report" after doing a science experiment lekovod the upcoming Parshiyos of Vayera and Chayei Sarah. (Ast your boys what the connection is.) Finally, the class has progressed in math and reading and are learning about the dangers posed to animals that endanger them and may lead to their becoming extinct.

This week Mrs. Volfman's third grade continued to learn to determine the value of coins and bills in their math unit. Using math coin manipulatives and an assortment of activities, the boys were able to have a hands-on experience of counting out amounts of money. In ELA the class read about kangaroos as they learned to describe connections between scientific ideas. In their poetry unit this week the boys enjoyed writing quatrain poems all about the fall. The week ended with the weekly "News On the Run".

Mrs. Levin's class is happy to be back at Cheder, their second home. The boys are sharpening their multiplication skills with regrouping. Practice!! Practice!! A foldable was made to recognize Common Nouns/Proper Nouns/Singular/Plural. Fifth grade has been campaigning madly in support of Trump. They await the final results. Stay tuned!!


