A PEEK AT OUR WEEK

This week, Dr. Schnitzel completed his lesson about air pressure. What an exciting way to learn science! Ask your sons (grades 1 through 6) about this exciting presentation.

Mrs. Nadav's class continued honing their writing skills this week. They have worked on using nouns, verbs, and proper nouns in sentences. This week they have been concentrating on questions, using Who? What? When? Where? and Why? The list of words on the word wall is growing ever larger, and the boys are adding many words to their vocabulary as well. This week there was a discussion about **homonyms**: two words which have the same spelling but different meanings. Some of the words the group came up with were bark, book, left, bat, park and Mayor! They realized that the word <u>light</u> actually has three meanings- a noun, a verb and a "description"!

The classroom now has such a wonderful Chanukah feel to it as the boys chose many different creative ways to decorate the walls. Dreidels and such hang from the ceiling, as well. The boys have learned to melt wax with a special machine, and they created very unique candles to use when they light their menorahs. We can't wait for Chanukah.....there are so many special activities planned for each day!

Our second graders had a great week! The boys did a wonderful job on their Chapter 3 math tests! They began Chapter 4 where they are learning 2 digit addition. Miss Klatzko uses real life scenarios to demonstrate these new skills and the boys practice the methods until they know them well. The boys are pros at getting into reading groups and taking turns reading. They are constantly learning new reading rules and are getting a chance to practice them in their readers.

What's a kickoff book? This exciting new program is a way to start off the English part of the day. The boys work on a booklet that has math and writing for the first few minutes of the day, thereby reinforcing old skills and applying them to the appropriate places. When they finish one booklet ,they get a certificate and go up a level.

Mrs. Volfman's third grade started their week with a fantastic science show from Dr. Schnitzel. They continued to learn new letters in their cursive writing unit as well as reinforced their multiplication strategies and facts. The class did a hands-on activity called the "Distributive Chop" to reinforce their understanding of the distributive property of multiplication. The boys used a multiplication equation to create an array out of chocolate lentils and then "chopped" their array to create two new equations.

In their writing unit, the class focused on writing paragraphs about why they are excited about the Yom Tov of Chanukah using topic sentences and then concluding sentences to support their reasons. In social studies, the class began a unit on fire safety.

Our Eighth graders used experimental probability to find what percent of dreidel spins would result in getting a nun, gimmel, hay, or shin. This fun activity had the boys playing dreidel while learning math skills at the same time!

Dear Parents שיחיו,

One of the central *minhagim* of Chanukah is to increase in the giving of Tzedakah.

As in the past, we are asking the cheder talmidim, with their parents' permission and supervision, to participate in the children's *Pushkah* Campaign to help raise funds for learning-centered programs at the Boy's cheder.

Chanuka is the festival of lights and Torah is light, *Torah ohr*. The funds of this campaign will be directed to providing extra support and incentives to students to improve their learning.

Every talmid will receive a labeled cheder pushkah and will be given an opportunity to collect tzedakah. Talmidim may collect tzedakah from neighbors on the block, or people they meet in their local shuls or at community celebrations, etc. Social distancing measures should be adhered to and respected in all settings. Talmidim may also donate part of their *maaser* for their chanukah *gelt*.

The cheder is offering incentives to encourage participation. We have put together a catalog of prizes which talmidim can earn per amount of money they raise. The prizes are not a raffle, prizes are given per qualifying amount collected. Samples of the prizes will be on display at the cheder.

The deadline for submitting pushkas and ordering from the catalog is Monday, 6 Teves, 5781.

We ask that you encourage your son/s to participate in this project in a way that raises the pride of our talmidim in the cheder and have them learn responsibility and integrity.
