A PEEK AT OUR WEEK

While the school week was condensed because of Shavuot, Mrs. Eckstein's third graders still managed to pack in lots of quality learning time. They have progressed to learning about equivalent fractions and reviewed nouns, verbs and adjectives. They have added pronouns and adverbs to their grammar repertoire, as well. In reading, they learned a story about an interesting picnic and began a unit on poetry where they learned about rhythm. In writing, the boys wrote about Shavuot (of course!) and since there was no News on the Run this week, they discussed updates on COVID laws and the current security crisis in Eretz Yisroel. Kudos to the boys who handed in their book reports early! They were due on Thursday.

On Wednesday our sixth graders enjoyed an impromptu STEM activity. The boys were challenged to make a tower out of paper and tape. The winners were determined by a formula that took into account the height of the tower and the number of papers used along with the ability to hold a 15 ounce can for sixty seconds without falling. The boys worked diligently, even through their recess break, to create strong towers that would meet all the criteria in order to win. Yasher Koach to all the students who put great effort into their work!

In the 7th grade, Mrs. Eckstein's class is continuing to learn about various literary terms and themes. They have learned about irony, humor and fantasy. This week they discussed metaphors. Mrs. Eckstein explained that metaphors are not just a *limudei chol 'zach'*; she pointed out how metaphors and allegories (aka *meshalim*) are an important concept in Torah as well. During the lesson, the boys wrote metaphors of their own and shared them with the rest of their class.
