#### LETTER FROM THE MENAHEL:

Dear Parents,

There is a phrase the *Rebbe* used often and has been popularized by Benny Friedman in the song *"Ivri anochi", בני אברהם יצחק ויעקב.* One may ask, why do *Chazal* use the name Yaakov rather than *Yisroel* in referring to the Yidden?

Chassidus explains that the name Yaakov is comprised of two words yud eikev. The yud represents Hashem in the highest form of hishtalshelus, chochmah. Ekev is the heal, the lowest part of the body and represents the lowest position in hishtalshelus. The heal has dead skin attached to it, representing the polar opposite of *chochmah* like the *posuk* says "Hachochmo techaye". Yaakov's role is to deliver the highest level of G-dliness to the lowest people and in the lowest places.

As a Chabad cheder the word Yaakov expresses clearly what our mission is. The Torah that we teach is meant to be Torah in its purest form, Yiddishkeit in its truest representation, uncompromising values and core beliefs of ultimate Yiddishkeit "chabad".

We strive to deliver these truths to every single child. We look for ways to reach those who seem not be spiritually sensitive, or seem to be looking for compromise. We don't tire from looking for ways to consistently and persistently imbue in our children the ultimate experience of Chabad *chassidus*, ultimate Yiddishkeit

Yud tes Kislev isn't just a yom tov, it is Rosh Hashonoh, the cycle of our seasons begins and ends with Chassidus. May we succeed in instilling these values on a deeper and deeper level in each of our talmidim every single day. May we merit the geulah of our personal mitzrayim and the collective Geulah before the ushering in of the New Year.






