LETTER FROM THE MENAHEL:

Dear Parents,

In this week's parshah, the Torah tells us that when a woman brings a *korbon* when she has a baby. Two birds, an *olah* and a *chatos* are obligated. The Mishnah explains that *hazooch* of the *olah* done on the top half of the *Mizbeiach* and for the *chatos* on the bottom half.

Two types of birds may be offered, pigeons or doves. If a woman promises to bring a specific one and forgets which type she promised, and if a *Kohen* forgot where he performed the *hazooch*, she must bring more birds than first promised to satisfy all the possibilities created by the confusion.

In other words, when things are clear we do a little and accomplish a lot. However, when there is confusion we end up doing and doing and may not even accomplish much.

In applying this to cheder, if we are clear about our identity, goals and expectations, we meet them easily. In a short Cheder-day, we daven and learn several subjects. We have recess, lunchtime, snack time, and general studies successfully all in a short day. However, if we are unsure about our identity, if one family pulls towards modernity and another towards the *shtetl*, if one family embodies a *chassidishe* look and behavior and the other a modern, Americanized look, One sees our General Studies program as being too much and the other as too little, than all the effort and time in the world cannot successfully accomplish our goals.

It is the Cheder's role to be clear about what we do. It is the parents role to know what our goals are and decide whether this is the right fit for their child. Once they chose Cheder they must fully accept, embrace and support our values fully at every step of our journey and partnership.

We work every day to sharpen the clarity of our goals, to make sure that we are meeting the Cheder goals and we ask that you help keep the message whole and not try to chip away at any of our values.


