In this week's parshah, Naso, we repeat the *korbonos* of the Nesiim twelve times. Each Sheivet dedicated the same combination of gifts to the Mishkan and the Torah repeats each set.


Rashi shares some deep insights into the precise measure and value of each offering explaining what they symbolize. He does this on the **second** day of offerings. The Rebbe explains that the reason Rashi waits until the second day is to tell us that although each *sheivet* brought the same physical items, the meaning behind the korbonos was different.

The cheder curriculum may look the same for every student but in truth, every student receives a unique learning experience. The journey of every student as a learner in cheder is unique. Our dedicated and innovative *melamdim* always look out for the best way to reach and improve the impact of the Torah-learning on each talmid.

In the Fifth Grade we are in countdown to our cumulative math final this coming Wednesday IYH which will include all the skills learned this year. The boys are working with a sample test and each day we review a few more examples. An email was sent home that outlined all the skills taught as well as a sample test. We have completed unit 19 in our Word-ly Wise books. After the completion of unit 20 there will be a final on all units. It is fairly easy and will be an open book final. In literature we began a new story, "The Day of the Turtle." We discussed the mood of the story as we see the main character's intensity of sadness and joy and caring. Dr. Schnitzel paid us a visit last week and we made goop!
