LETTER FROM THE MENAHEL:

Dear Parents,

The current release of hostages is in the news. Pictures and videos of emotional scenes showing hostages reuniting with their families have been blasted all over the news and social media, warming our hearts.

At the same time, we must remember that what may look like a celebration, may be a tragedy. It is our duty to listen to what the Torah tells us and to pay special attention to what the Rebbe repeated and cried about from the depths of his heart.

The Rebbe spoke with deep pain about the absolute mistake and *aveirah* of negotiating with terrorists, redeeming hostages at such a price placing in even greater danger every single Jew and causing death and captivity of other Jews in the future without a doubt *r"l*. The many errors in the way this is happening are too many to list. Sharing the joy on social media makes our enemies more powerful and is cruel to the widows and orphans of those soldiers who were killed, whose relatives will never return.

This isn't the platform to set the record straight on such matters, nor is it my goal, however, this is the time to once again bring to your attention that any insignia, flags or logos relating to the state of Israel army are not allowed in cheder.

The State of Israel represents the desecration of Hashem and His Torah. The Rebbe stated clearly that Zionism pushes delays the *Geulah*. While there are other opinions, the cheder isn't a place to feature many opinions, it is a place where we teach the Reb-

be's view, positions and instructions on all matters to the exclusion of all others.

We had a fantastic week filled with enthusiastic and creative learning! In math, we focused on memorizing the multiplication tables for 3, 5, and 10. While working on worksheets, I demonstrated how to identify patterns and shortcuts to make problem-solving easier. For example, knowing that $5 \times 4 = 20$ can help when solving 6×4 . Next week, we will continue reviewing these concepts. In the meantime, please ask your son about the "9 trick"—it's a fun and useful way to work with multiples of 9! In social studies and map skills, we explored how communities organize and establish rules, including different decision-making methods like voting. We also discussed the structure of governance, from towns and cities to states and countries,

and how nations form alliances and systems over time. For map skills, we used an interactive globe to develop a sense of direction and navigation. We practiced using a compass, identifying directions such as traveling from Washington State to New York, which is an east-northeast route across the United States. Overall, the boys were highly engaged and excited about their learning experiences this week! It was great to see everyone back at Cheder, with refreshing color to their faces, looking well-rested and rejuvenated. On Tuesday, after returning from the Ohel, the boys shared how meaningful this experience was for them and they understood the koach of the tefillos of young children. They unwinded, as they watched the Tzivos Hashem Yud Shevat Rally, which added further inspiration to their day. We introduced a reading strategy, Visualizing, using the five senses, to create vivid images and bring our stories to life. We read a poem about a snowman and discussed the describing words we use: white, round, cold, to create the image. Another poem, about Wind, we spoke about, what happens to the trees, windows, hats on our heads, garbage pails etc. on a windy day, which are usually still and quiet. In Math, we are mountain climbers, reaching new heights, by adding three and four numbers to find the sum. The Idiom of the week was "Couch Potato." The boys chuckled when I hinted that the next day may be a snowstorm and they should NOT become "couch potatoes." Iy"H next week, we will be tested on our "EA" spelling words. We are looking forward to completing the 6-7-8-12 times tables over the course of the next week or so, together with Division! This week marked the first full week in February. Mrs. Eckstein explained that February tends to be the snowiest month. Being that it snowed twice this past week, with more in the forecast for next week, the boys wrote compositions on The Snowman who Opened his Eyes. The talmidim are definitely becoming more proficient in paragraph writing, and stories like this enable them to use their imaginations. In addition, reading their compositions aloud boosts their self-confidence and lets them practice public speaking. Of course the highlight of the week was the trip to the OHEL on Tuesday, followed by an amazing Yud Shevat Rally! The boys were given questions to answer as they watched the Rally, and Rabbi Blotner gave out a prize to the boys who completed the most correct answers. In Science, lekovod Tu B'shvat, we began a new Unit, on plants. If you walk into our classroom, you will see little bags hanging on the wall and window. We learned about Scientific Theory: We came up with a question and hypothesis, and next week iy"H we will analyze our facts and come to a conclusion! Stay tuned! Finally, kudos to Dovi Setton, Lipa Isenberg, Aaron Shurpin, Yossi Levertov and Levi Goldberg for working on the challenging Logic worksheets that Mrs. Eckstein distributed on Wednesday, in the event of a Snow Day on Thursday. 














