LETTER FROM THE MENAHEL:

Dear Parents,

When we read about the story of the מכות, we discover that the goal of striking them was education. Hashem said 'וידעו מצרים כי אני ה' the *Mitzriim* will know that I am Hashem. *Chassidus* brings another use of the word וידעו which means to break.

One may ask, is breaking a way to educate? Isn't love and understanding the right way to educate?

The *posuk* says, ותהי יראתם אתי מצות אנשים מלמדה (Yeshaya 29:13) This refers to people who perform mitzvos by rote, because that is the way they were raised. The posul only makes reference to fear. One can ask why does the *posuk* not include those whose love of Hashem is automated, by rote?

The answer is that love must be experienced, it cannot be taught. We can create a setting in which love will flourish, but we can't instill it. However, discipline, respect and awe are taught and it is the responsibility of educators and parents to provide limits and 'break' laziness, self-interest and apathy to train soldiers in Hashem's army.

Remember to say Tehilim!
