LETTER FROM THE MENAHEL:

The weekly newsletter message is usually written to your parents. However, today, in honor of Parshas Tesaveh, I thought of writing something to you. Tesaveh is the only Parsha in which Moshe is called 'you" and never mentioned by name.

In the last maimer given out by the Rebbe, Moshe Rabbeinu is called רועה אמונה , he feeds the Yidden *emunah*. This idea is important to cheder life and how we view our talmidim.

Sometimes students describe themselves as being a certain way, Smart or not, having faith or not, hardworking or not. Calling Moshe Rabbienu a shepherd of *emunah* means that the level of *emunah* in Yidden can change and become stronger, as Moshe teaches them.

When we look at you, we see where you are, but we also think about where you can reach. Some students don't think of themselves like this, they describe themselves as being a certain way, as being, lazy, a picky eater, anxious, uncomfortable with change, liking or not liking sports, all these things aren't fixed, they can change. Some people are born with advantages, but truly great people become that way by working hard, with effort to reach the goals that are out of reach now, but they can be reached.

As we get closer to Yud Aleph Nissan, let's all think about what we can do to change and improve ourselves and not describe ourselves as being a certain way.

Thank you all for teaching me patience, helping me listen to you and sharing what is going on in your day so that the cheder can accommodate your challenges. While we aim to help you, we always keep in mind that no student is free from learning and davening, we want to help you, make it easier, but not to make you numberom responsibility.

Veata tesaveh es benei Yisroel, we are all attached and connected with Hashem, under all circumstances, on each and every day.
