#### LETTER FROM THE MENAHEL:

Dear Parents,

In this week's parshah, the Torah speaks about bullying. Here is the *pasuk* and Rashi: <u>כל אלמנה ויתום לא תענון. **רשי:**</u> הוא הדין לכל אדם, אלא שדבר הכתוב בהווה, לפי שהם תשושי כח ודבר מצוי לענותם.

Loosely translated, the *posuk* says don't torture a widow or orphan. Rashi adds, this is true for all people but the *posuk* speaks in a common setting, these represent the weak who are commonly tortured. The Torah addresses the imbalance of power, the weak are tortured for no reason other than someone stronger than them asserting their power and hurting them.

Being a principal is a position of power. My goal in speaking to parents is to level the playing field so that we are on equal footing. The balance is delicate since my responsibility to as a school leader remains. My intention here to let you know my goal.

Equal footing allows for an exchange of ideas rather than one-sided demands placed on either party. Flexibility and collaboration benefit the children. Our children's benefit is the goal of our partnership and should permeate our exchanges.

As someone who grew up on shlichus, I wasn't ready for a large city school. At the time, I was far from home and shocked at what I encountered. The physical and verbal abuse, and aggression were beyond what I could content with.

The purpose of sharing this today is to extend a hand to those who are hesitant to reach out. We are all Hashem's children, of the same generation, all of the same status,

I'd like to take a moment to share what we've been working on this week. In our spelling lesson (Lesson 24), we focused on CVCV words, particularly those with a long u sound, such as tune. We also explored CVV words like due. In math (Volume 3), we took a small dive into place value. The students were introduced to larger numbers, such as 72,000. The boys learned that the 7 is in the ten thousand place, though we clarified that there is no "ten thousand million billion" - yet. Who knows, maybe one day. It takes some getting used to, but they are making great progress! Finally, we added an exciting review to our lessons by exploring how a compass works. Using an interactive live map on the board,

we examined directions and the role of a compass in navigation. To make it even more engaging, we used the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans as our starting points. In our quest to become more knowledgeable about the world Hashem created, we are continuing to study the map. This week we focused on the five largest oceans of the world and also on the continents and their respective sizes. Asia is the largest continent. China, Japan, Russia, India and Turkey are among the various countries that can be found in Asia. Australia is the smallest continent. In addition to geography, we spent a good part of the week learning new math skills and reviewing old ones. The skills that were introduced were how to convert a decimal to a fraction and then convert a fraction to a decimal. Please note, there will be a major math test at the end of the coming week. I sent home a sample of the test with the parents at PTC. The boys will also be getting a copy of it and we will review each skill. May I suggest that you ask your son if he knows these skills and encourage him to listen as I review it. There is not enough time for me to personally teach each child each skill. A good idea is to tune in when he isn't sure of how to do it. We started a new story about a grandfather and grandson. The story centers around a child's growing awareness of how much he is able to enrich his grandfather's life. The class enthusiastically shared about their relationships with their grandparents. 







